



RABBI SOLOMON B. FREEHOF is an alumnus of the Hebrew Union College, ordained in 1915. During the First World War he was a chaplain in the American Expeditionary Force. After his ordination he continued as a member of the faculty of his alma mater; in 1924 he became rabbi of Kehillath Anshe Maariv Temple in Chicago; and in 1934 he became rabbi of Rodef Shalom Temple in Pittsburgh, of which he is now Rabbi Emeritus. He is a former president of the Central Conference of American Rabbis, and Honorary Life President of the World Union for Progressive Judaism. He is the author of *Stormers of Heaven*; *The Book of Psalms, A Commentary*; *Modern Jewish Preaching*; *The Small Sanctuary*; *Reform Jewish Practice* (2 vols.); *Preface to Scripture*; *The Responsa Literature*; *Book of Job, A Commentary*; *Reform Responsa*; *Recent Reform Responsa*; *Current Reform Responsa*; *Modern Reform Responsa*, *Contemporary Reform Responsa*, *Spoken and Heard*; *Bible Sermons for Today*; *Preaching the Bible: Sermons for Sabbaths and High Holy Days*; and others.
